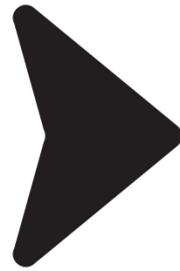

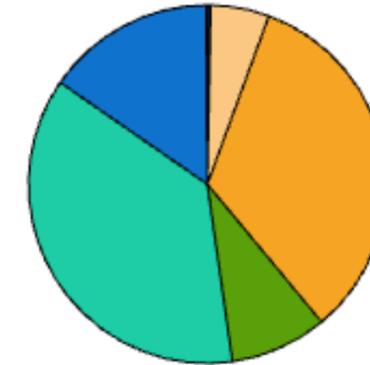
# Erie's Public Schools

- Urban
- **10,500** Students

## Percent Enrollment by Student Groups

Economically Disadvantaged	88.7%
English Language Learner	10.8%
Special Education	23.3%
Foster Care	NA
Homeless	2.6%

## Percent Enrollment by Race/Ethnicity



 American Indian/Alaskan Native	0.3%
 Asian	5.3%
 Black	33.4%
 Native Hawaiian or other Pacific Islander	0.1%
 Hispanic	8.8%
 White	36.9%
 2 or More Races	15.3%



# United Way of Erie County

- Issue focused
- Mission is to break the cycle of generational poverty through education
- Serves as the backbone organization for Community Schools in Erie County
  - Employs Community School Directors
  - Leads the data collection and evaluation
  - Facilitates strategy development to remove non-academic barriers
  - Coordinates partner alignment
  - Leads resource development efforts
  - Leads the marketing and brand management
  - Facilitates collaborative meetings and difficult conversations
  - Leads and supports systems-level change

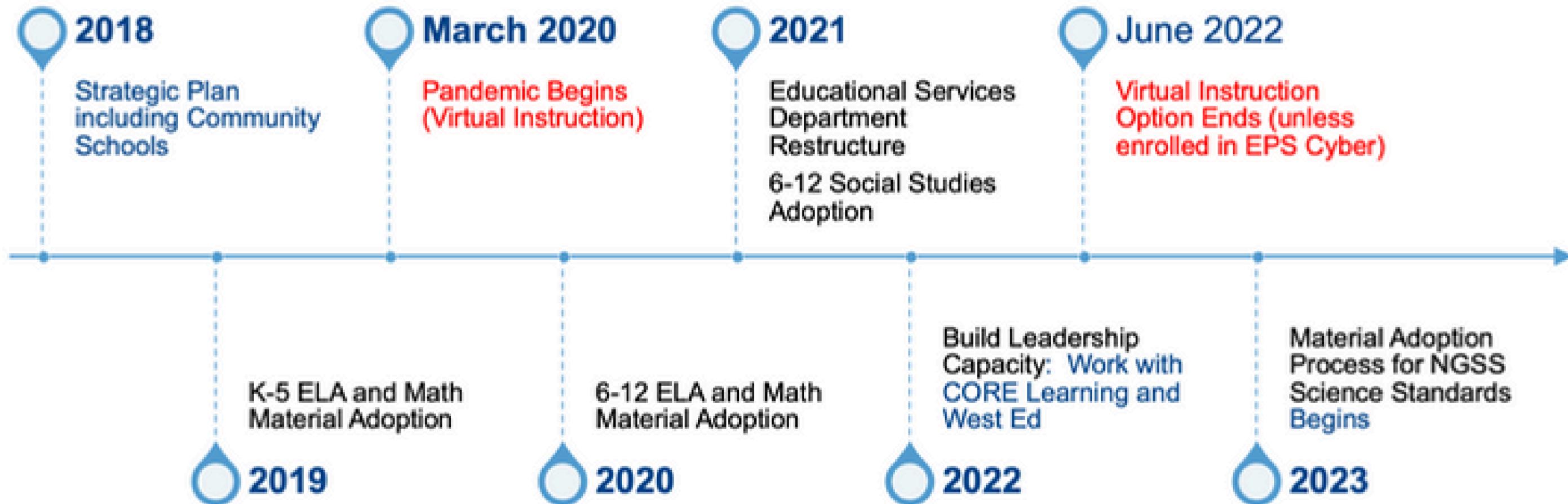


## It is working!

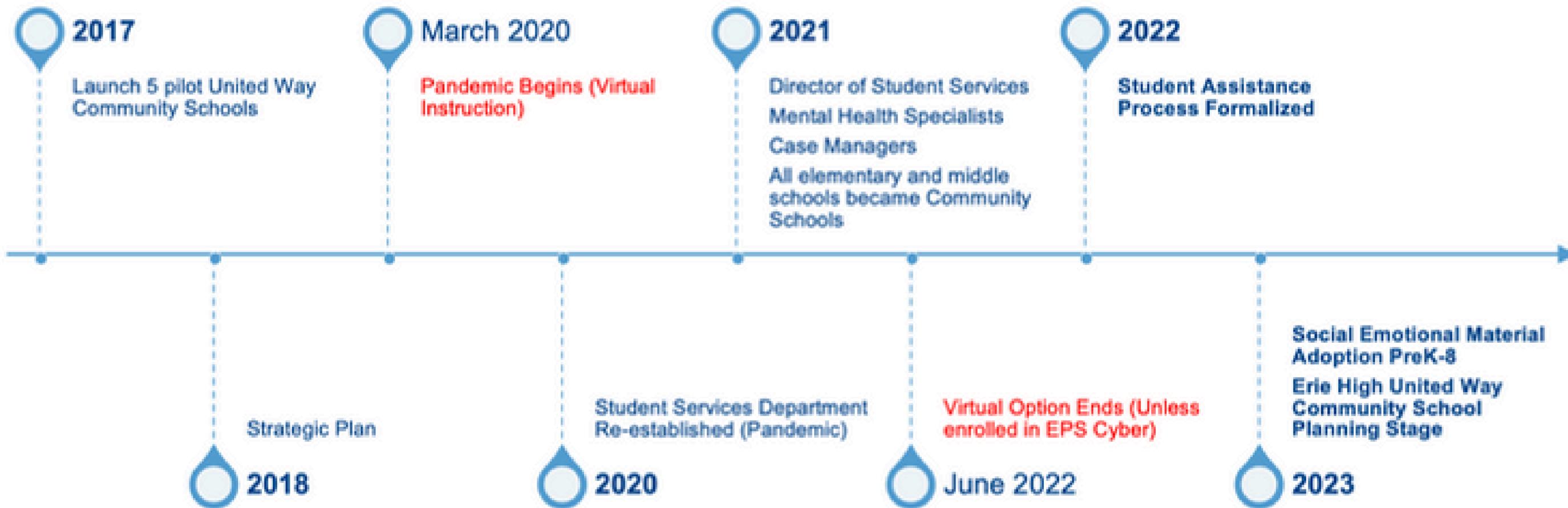
- Established a formalized framework for implementing the community school model in Erie County
- Alignment of dozens of impact partners to strategically address non-academic barriers
- Securing millions of dollars in new funding to support the work
- Successfully removing non-academic barriers and improving student academic growth and proficiency

# Key Elements



## Commitment

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Commitment from both the district and backbone organization is essential

Examples from EPS include:

- Inclusion of community school expansion in the district's most recent strategic plan
- EPS directed ESSER funding to support the expansion of the model to more schools
- School Board adopted a policy in support of Community Schools in January 2025
- Sustaining FSCS case management program



# Key Elements



## Commitment

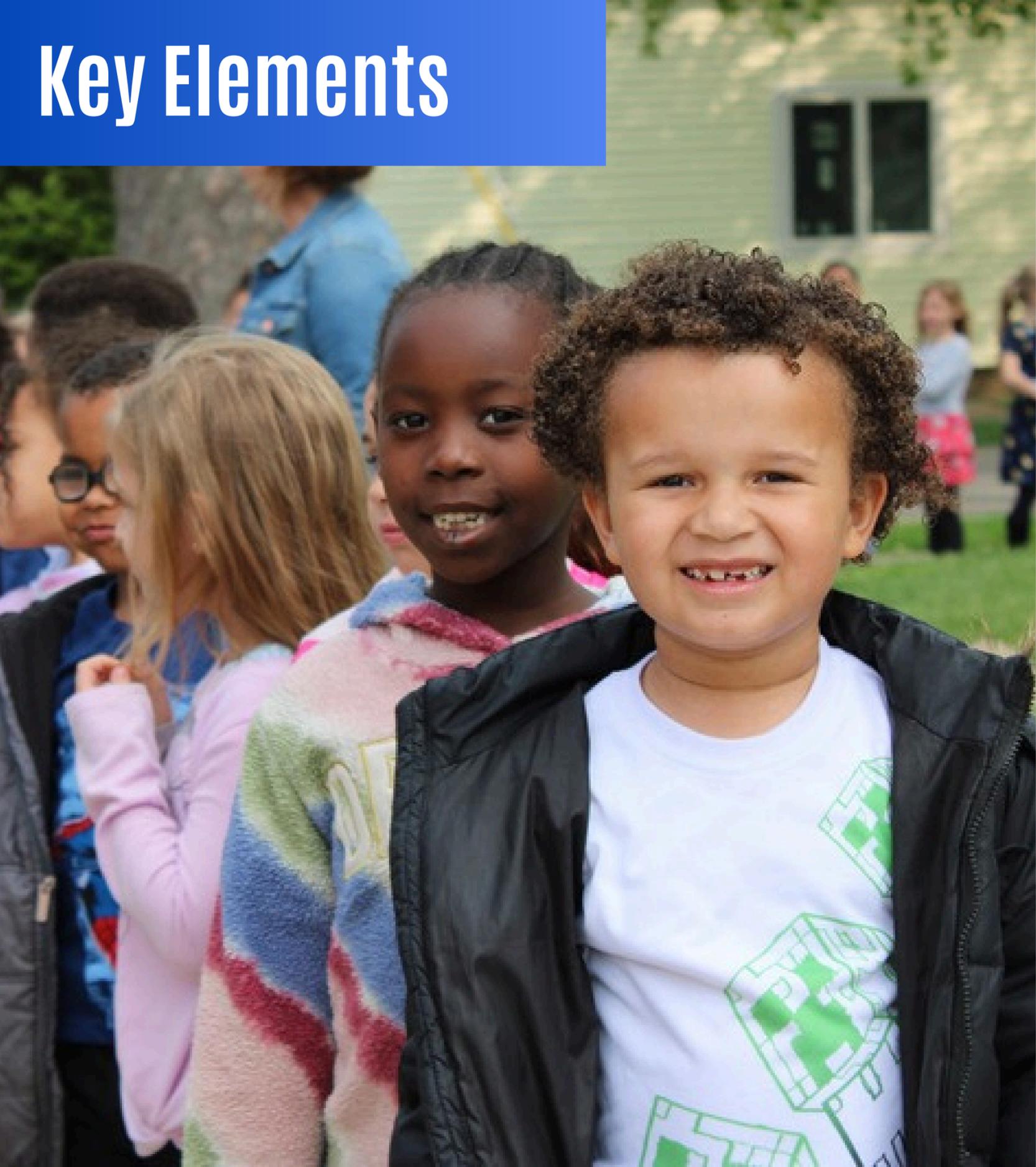
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Examples from UWEC include:

- Community Schools has become UWEC's primary focus
- Restructured the entire organization to serve as the backbone organization for Community Schools
  - Departments
  - Staffing
  - Funding
- Board and committee service
- Agreements with school districts



# Key Elements



## Communication

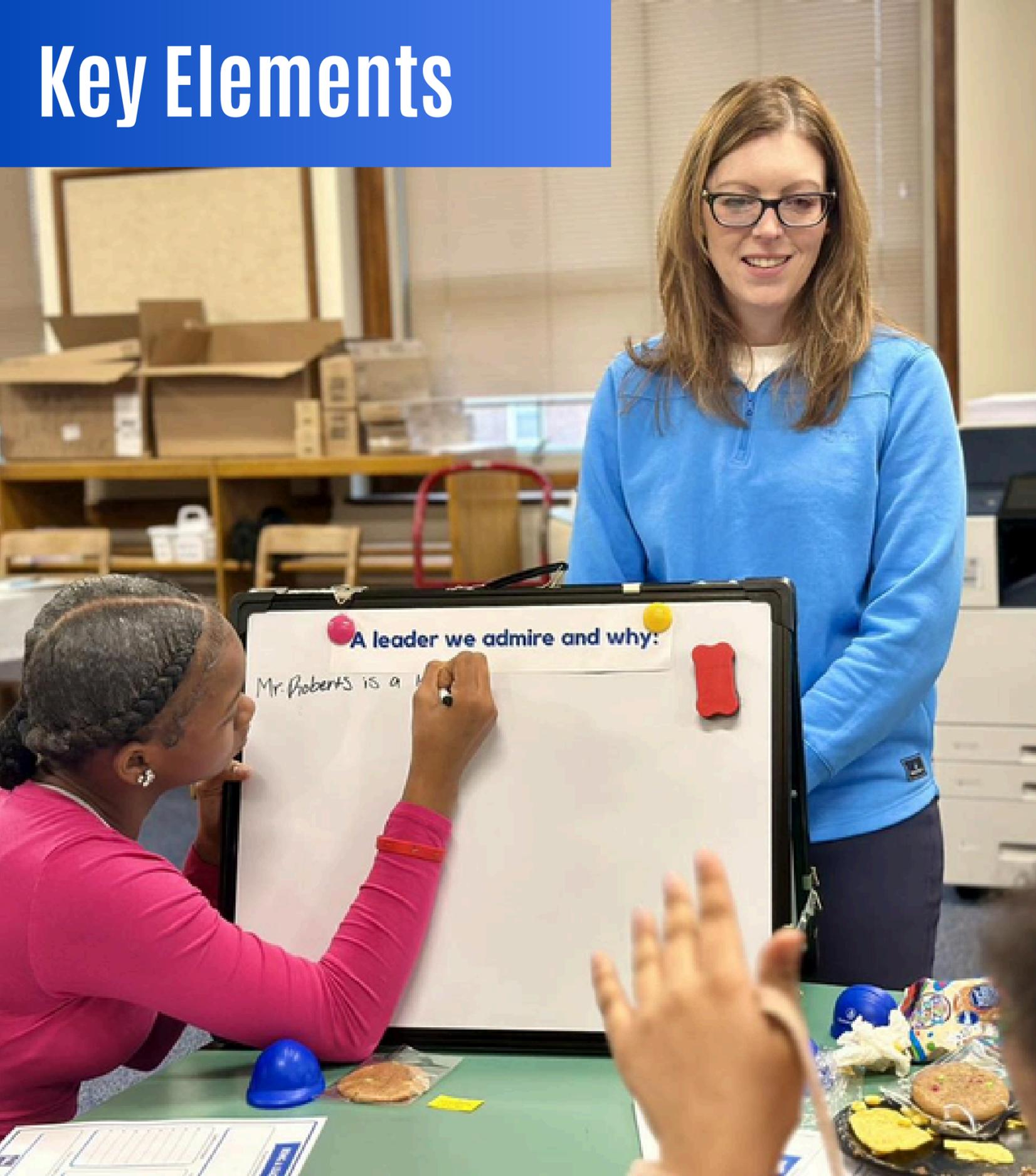
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Strong lines of communication between school districts and backbone organizations is critical

- Helps ensure the work continues at a steady pace, that roles and responsibilities are clearly defined and that resources are strategically aligned



# Key Elements



## Communication

Examples:

- Weekly planning meetings with senior leadership to share status updates and to discuss opportunities and challenges
- Ad hoc planning meetings to focus on specific topics (e.g. process improvements)
- Community school annual progress reports, school board presentations, in-service day presentations, etc.

# Collaboration

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## Hiring Processes

- Joint participation in relevant staff hiring committees and evaluations

## Data Sharing

- United Way CSDs and Data Mgrs. access the SIS
- Collaborative survey processes for stakeholders

## Resource Development and Leveraged Funding

- Resource development meetings and community school tours
- District funds used to support community schools
  - ESSER
  - Title I
- Collaborative grant applications to fund key initiatives
- United Way funding



# Key Elements



## Collaboration

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### Marketing and Strategic Communications

- Coordinated messaging
- Joint outreach to city and county governments
- Joint press events
- United Way staff help administer school social media pages and parent communication app

### Policies and Procedures

- Significant overhauls to related district policies and procedures
  - Student Assistance Program
  - Volunteers
  - Data collection and use
  - Program partnership agreements
