



# COMMUNITY SCHOOL ACTION PLANS 101

## What is an Action Plan?

United Way of Erie County's Community School Model is a data-driven strategy designed to remove non-academic barriers to student success. Each Community School develops a unique Action Plan, which is a written report that analyzes data to identify needs and gaps within the school, organized through ten Model-wide goals. Once needs and gaps are identified, CSDs work from a Community School Strategy Bank to implement action steps to address those barriers.

## How is an Action Plan Created?

After the CSD assembles their school leadership team, the action planning process begins. With support from United Way's Data Team, CSDs review existing school, district, and community-level data to conduct a needs and gaps analysis. CSDs and their teams then design surveys and focus groups involving three key stakeholder groups: students, families, and staff. Survey questions and focus group topics address areas such as school culture, barriers to success, and more.

## When is an Action Plan finished?

In the first year, CSDs and their teams complete the Action Plan by collecting and analyzing data and finalizing action steps for implementation. While the Action Plan is completed during the first year, it continues to guide the school's work as data is ongoingly collected and analyzed.

## Who writes an Action Plan?

Action Plans are written by the Community School Director (CSD), with input and technical assistance from United Way's Data Team. Members of the school leadership team and school administration also actively participate in the Action Plan process.

# ACTION PLAN NEEDS/GAP MATRIX

An Action Plan Needs/Gap Matrix is completed for every identified need at a Community School. The different components of the matrix help the Community School Team understand where gaps can be filled.
