

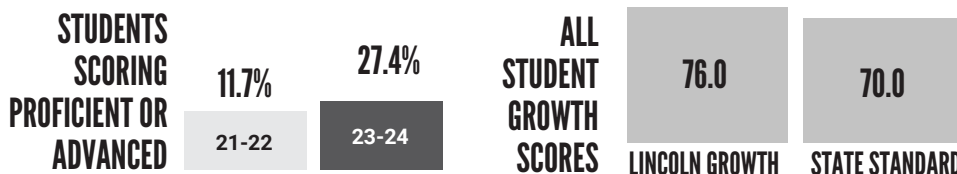

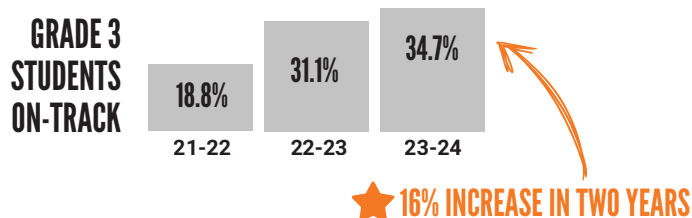

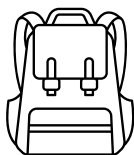
INCREASED PERCENTAGE OF STUDENTS DEMONSTRATING GRADE 3 ON-TRACK READING PERFORMANCE

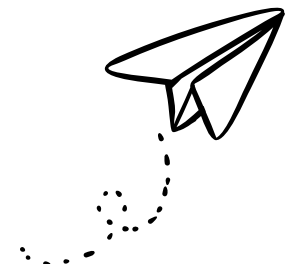
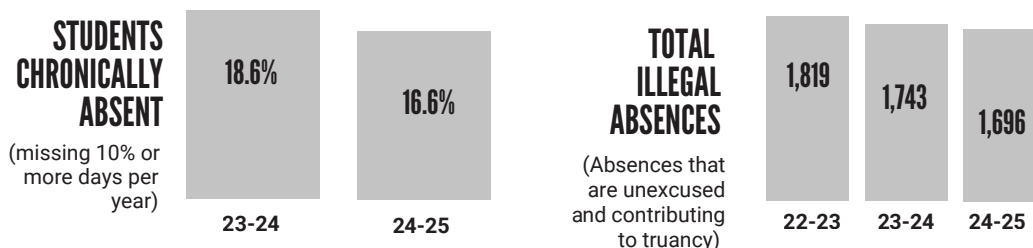


This year, a classroom reading program called **Books with Bankers** was launched with Lincoln's Corporate Partner Coalition. Corporate Partner volunteers joined classrooms once a month to read to the class. Each bank in the coalition was matched with a grade level, and volunteers stayed with their classrooms all year so that strong relationships could be built with students. Banks will move with their grade level next year to continue those relationships. Over the course of six sessions, 32 volunteers joined Lincoln's classrooms!

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMMING

INCREASED OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS

This year, Lincoln Elementary grew their after-school programming framework to expand opportunities to more students! In the 24-25 year:

- Grades 3-5 had access to 3 programs per quarter and Grades 1-2 had access to 1 program per quarter for a total of 16 unique programs
- 116 unduplicated students participated in after-school enrichment programming - 68 more than the 23-24 year
- Lincoln worked with 12 unique program partners - 5 more than the previous year



SUCCESS STORY: GRADE LEVEL MEET AND GREET NIGHTS



In response to family survey feedback, Lincoln launched Grade Level Family Meet and Greet Nights to help families connect with others in the same grade. Teachers could opt to plan activities or invite program partners, resulting in events like cooking with Common Threads, STEM night with Penn State Behrend, and stress-reduction with NAMI. All events took place before Parent-Teacher Conferences and were well-attended. Both staff and families shared overwhelmingly positive feedback, and this strategy will be implemented in the coming year so family relationships can continue to grow!
