

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAMMING

INCREASED OPPORTUNITIES FOR STUDENTS

This year, Lincoln Elementary grew their after-school programming framework to expand opportunities to more students! In the 24-25 year:

- Grades 3-5 had access to 3 programs per guarter and Grades 1-2 had access to 1 program per quarter for a total of 16 unique programs
- 116 unduplicated students participated in after-school enrichment programming - 68 more than the 23-24 year
- Lincoln worked with 12 unique program partners 5 more than the previous year





SUCCESS STORY: GRADE LEVEL MEET AND GREET NIGHTS



In response to family survey feedback, Lincoln launched Grade Level Family Meet and Greet Nights to help families connect with others in the same grade. Teachers could opt to plan activities or invite program partners, resulting in events like cooking with Common Threads, STEM night with Penn State Behrend, and stress-reduction with NAMI. All events took place before Parent-Teacher Conferences and were wellattended. Both staff and families shared overwhelmingly positive feedback, and this strategy will be implemented in the coming year so family relationships can continue to grow!
