



CAREER AND TECHNICAL EDUCATION PROGRAMS

Erie High offers **18 career and technical education programs**. These programs prepare students for college, careers, industry certifications and state credentials that allow students to pursue multiple pathways after graduation.

Auto Body Technician

Straightening, replacing, painting and finishing work on automobiles.

Certifications: OSHA 10. S/P2, Safety and Pollution Prevention, S/P2 Automotive, ASE

Auto Mechanics Technology

Repair on automobile engines, tires, transmissions and assignments, pre inspections and preventative maintenance.

Certifications: OSHA 10. S/P2, Safety and Pollution Prevention, S/P2 Automotive, ASE, State Inspection License.

Childcare and Support Services

Childhood growth and development, program planning and management, safety and more.

Certifications: Child Development Associate (CDA), Basic Life Saving (CPR/First Aid/ AED), Babysitting A+, Security+, IC3

Criminal Justice

Prepares individuals to perform entry-level duties as a patrolman, corrections officer, juvenile officer, security officer and probation officer. The American legal system, techniques used in police laboratory and training in emergency disaster situations.

Certifications: MDTS (Modern Defensive Training Systems), MOAB (Management of Aggressive Behavior), OCAT (Oleoresin Capsicum Aerosol Training), PATH (Practical and Tactical Handcuffing), PPBT (Personal Protection Baton Tactics), EMT, NIMS (National Incident Management System 100,200,700,800) Basic Life Saving (CPR/First Aid/ AED)

Computer Programming

Fundamentals of computer design and repair as well as several common programming languages.

Certifications: Microsoft Office (Individual Certifications-Word, Excel, Access, PowerPoint), IT Fundamentals, A+, Security+, IC3

Construction Trades

Electrical, carpentry, plumbing, and masonry

Certifications: OSHA 10, S/P2, NCCER (National Center for Construction Education and Research), Various Credentials (masonry, carpentry, electricity, HVAC, plumbing), Fork Life Operator

Cosmetology

Theory and practical care in skin, nails and hair as well as business and interpersonal skills

Certifications: OSHA, S/P2 Cosmetology, PA State Board Licensed Cosmetologist.

Culinary Arts

Use and care of kitchen equipment, menu planning, food preparation and restaurant management.

Certifications: OSHA, ProStart National Certification, ServeSafe/Manager Food Safety Certification, ServeSafe Food Handler Certification, S/P2 Culinary
